## Explanation Technique of Sonnet's important lines.

These lines have been taken from "Sonnet 29" by William Shakespeare. Shakespeare is one of the best dramatists as well as poets of the world. He wrote many major dramas & 154 sonnets. The present sonnet addresses W. H. Cole who is bosom friend of Shakespeare. It is a fourteen lined poem usually written in iambic pentameter. This Shakespearean sonnet consists of one octave and sestet. It is also called English sonnet.

These lines begin with the description of the Shakespeare's discontent and his lamentation over the miserable plight of life. Here the speaker says through these lines that he has fallen out of favour with fortune and men. He feels lonely and weeps over his position as a social outcast. He prays to heaven but his cries go unheard. He curses his poor fate for his miserable condition. He also feels abandoned and useless. He wishes to be rich, satisfied and fortunate like them but meets only failures and disappointments. After cursing his present sad state,
