Special features of Ctenophora (Comb jellies)

1. Oppositely placed tentacles in sheaths.
2. Presence of aboral sense organ.
3. Absence of Nematocysts and presence of baso cells.
4. Trophoblastic because of the presence of well-developed ectomesoderm.
5. Absence of epitheliomuscular cells.
6. Eight locomotor meridional ciliated bands or comb rows.
7. Digestive system with aboral anal pores.
8. Development involves gastrula-like stage formed by epiboly or overgrowth.
9. Determinate type of development.

Some zoologists (especially Long) have advocated the view that Ctenophora lead directly to the polyclad flatworms (Turbellaria).
